April 14, 2020

The City of Taylorsville City Commission held a Regular Meeting on April 14, 2020 at 5 p.m. at the City Hall Annex via teleconference.

Item # 1- Opening Remarks

Mayor Douglas called the meeting to order at 5:00 PM. and stated that this meeting was being conducted via teleconference. Clerk Biven called the roll. Mayor Douglas, Commissioner Shelburne, and Commissioner Nation were in attendance

Item # 2- COVID-19

- a) Chris Limpp Chief of Medical Services Mr. Limpp gave an update on the Covid19 virus.
- b) Municipal Order 2020-4 Extension & Municipal Order 2020-5 Extension.

 Motion made by Commissioner Shelburne and seconded by Commissioner Nation to extend the executive order 2020-4 Declaring a State of Emergency and Municipal Order 2020-5 Delegating Executive Functions until May 12, 2020. Motion carried 3-0.
- c) Ratification of Administrative Decisions

Motion made by Commissioner Nation and seconded by Mayor Douglas to <u>ratify</u> <u>administrative decisions</u> made by the City Clerk in response to the Governor's recommended actions regarding the Covid-19 virus and to extend June 1st.

Item #3- Consent Calendar

Motion was made by Commissioner Shelburne and seconded by Commissioner Nation to approve the consent calendar for the month of March 2020. Motion carried with a vote of 3-0.

Motion was made by Mayor Douglas and seconded by Commissioner Nation to <u>approve</u> Ms. Ingram's hours for the month of March Motion carried with a vote of 3-0.

Item #7 – Old Business

a) KU Franchise Agreement – Ordinance #405 (Second Reading).
 Mayor Douglas read Ordinance #405 Authorizing the creation of franchise for electric services.

Motion made by Commissioner Nation and seconded by Commissioner Shelburne to approve Ordinance #405. Motion carried 3-0.

b) Mowing Services Contracts

Motion made by Mayor Douglas and seconded by Commissioner Nation to <u>approve the mayor signing the mowing contracts</u> with Tammy's Creation and Mark Armstrong. Motion carried 3-0.

Commissioner Ingram joined the meeting via teleconference

Item #8 – New Business

a) Compensation of Elected Officials – Ordinance #406 (First Reading)

Motion made by Commissioner Ingram and seconded by Commissioner Nation to keep the city commissioners' salary at its present rate, providing for cost of living adjustments as to be determined in the budget process Motion carried 4-0

A meeting was scheduled for Friday, April 17th at 5:00 PM to have the second reading of the ordinance.

b) Department Reports

i. Police

Police Chief Sumner discussed the level of activity in his department during the Covid-19 virus. He also mentioned the fire that occurred to the house across the street from City Hall last night.

ii. Utility

Old South Plantation Development - Clerk Biven continued the discussion from previous meetings explaining the new road and drainage designs and inspections, and the role of the city engineer. The Developer of Old South Plantation had asked Sisler-Maggard to do the design themselves. After further analysis, the clerk recommended that we allow the City Engineering firm to do the design "if asked" by the developers.

Motion was made by Mayor Douglas and seconded by Commissioner Nation <u>for the City</u> Engineer to design and inspect the construction of drainage and roads on developments if requested by the developer. Motion carried 4-0.

Stimulus Package – Clerk Biven stated that KIPDA had contacted him about submitting "shovel ready" projects to KIA in anticipation of federal funds being distributed to improve the economy. A list of projects has been sent to KIPDA with the Bloomfield waterline being the top priority that we have designed and estimated cost.

Motion made by Mayor Douglas and seconded by Commissioner Ingram to <u>send the Bloomfield Waterline Extension design to the Division of Water</u>. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion was made by Mayor Douglas and seconded by Commissioner Ingram to <u>allow for 100% bond to cover only a partial development of a subdivision rather than the entire platted development that may never actually be built upon.</u>

Motion carried with a vote of 4-0.

Potholes & Paving Garrard Street

A list of potholes that we need to have addressed was presented to the Commission for review. The work on these and the paving of Garrard St. will each be bid out.

iii. Financial Report – Comptroller Randy McConnell
 Mr. McConnell's information was provided in the Commissioners' packet.
 Budget meetings will be delayed until business returns to normal.
