Objectives of the Taylorsville-Spencer County Comprehensive Plan.





"We're just all kind of numbed to the fact. Forty three is pretty young and this was pretty unexpected," he said.

"When it's one of our own, it's really hard," said Spencer County EMS Director Chris Limpp, who not only was Craig's boss, but a part of her extended family within the EMS.

Ken said Jenniffer started her firefighting career while the couple lived outside Buffalo, NY. When Ken's job at Ford brought him to Louisville, they settled in Taylorsville and Jenniffer insisted on living close to a fire station. Once settled in, they immediately became involved with the fire department.

Nation said they joined about six years ago and he called Craig "a very dedicated member" with a "very bubbly personality."

Four years ago, she also started work at Spencer County EMS. Workers there often pull 12 or 24 hour shifts, so a lot of time is spent together. Craig soon became a permanent fixture at the station, even when she wasn't officially on duty.

Friends said Craig was much like a mother hen. She was frequently baking cookies and cupcakes and bringing them to the EMS building, and was there to talk, encourage and just be a friend.

"She would always put other people's needs in front of her own," said Jessi Limpp, Chris's wife.

"We hung out at home and we would call," said Jessi. While Craig did not have any children of her own, her friends' children soon became like her own. Chris said his own children called her "Aunt Jenny" and friend Sarah Jenkins said her children were
