Item #1- Mayor Douglas called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. Clerk Biven called the roll.

## Item #2 – Public Hearing on Property Tax Rates

Public comment was sought regarding the proposed property tax rate and tax ordinance. The proposal this year was to increase the current tax rate to 14.80 cents per \$100 of assessed value for real property and to increase the personal property rate to 16.22 cents per \$100. There were no public comments regarding the rates.

#### Item #3 - Ordinance T-2022 Property Tax Rates (First Reading)

Mayor Douglas read Ordinance T-2022 as a first reading of the ordinance. The second reading will take place Friday, September 23, 2022, at 5:00 p.m.

#### Item #4 – Ordinance #429 - Budget Amendment 22-23 (First Reading)

Mayor Douglas read Ordinance #429 the Budget Amendment providing for additional funding in the General Fund for repair work on Early Wyne Drive and \$210,000 out of the General Fund to purchase school property.

## Item #5 – Tourism Committee Appointment

Motion made by Mayor Douglas and seconded by Commissioner Ingram to <u>reappoint</u> Bonnie Downs to the Tourism Committee to serve a 3-year term. Motion carried 4-0.

#### Item #6 – *Pest Control*

Motion made by Commissioner Spears and seconded by Mayor Douglas <u>to continue</u> contracting services from Mid-State Exterminators. Motion carried 4-0.
