**Item #1 – Consent Calendar**

**Motion was made by Mayor Spencer and seconded by Commissioner Hilbert to approve the Consent Calendar. Motion carried with a vote of 5-0.**

**Item #2 – Comments by the Mayor**

No report was given at this time

**Item # 3- Reports on Meetings Attended by Commission Members**

No report was given at this time.

**Item #4 - Commissioners Report on Departments**

No report was given at this time.

**Item #5- Tim Prather, Early Learning Center**

Tim Prather with the Early Learning Center spoke to the Commission about an encroachment for a sidewalk extension on Reasor Street. Public Works Director, Harold Compton said he had not had a chance to look at the sidewalk and existing waterlines but would do so as soon as possible.

**Motion was made by Commissioner Hilbert and seconded by Mayor Spencer to approve the encroachment, upon Public Works Director, Harold Compton's review. Motion carried with a vote of 5-0.**

**Item #6- Rev. John Lewis, Second Baptist Church – Senior Housing Project**

Rev. John Lewis asked the Commission for a letter of support for the construction of a new senior housing project. Representatives with the Winterwood Development Company spoke about infrastructure and what type of housing would be available.

**Motion was made by Mayor Spencer and seconded by Commissioner Spears to do a letter of support for the new construction of senior housing. Motion carried with a vote of 5-0.**

**Item #7-Donald Pay, Colonial Life**

Donald Pay with Colonial Life spoke to the Commission about supplemental insurance for employees. Donald Pay said there would be no participant requirements, it would be payroll deducted and could have an effective date of September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025, if he could meet with employees by early August.

**Item #8– Committee Report**

**a. Main Street (Beverly Ingram, Main Street Manager)**

Beverly Ingram, Main Street Manager, addressed the Commission with a report for June.

**Motion was made by Mayor Spencer and seconded by Commissioner Bentley to approve Beverly Ingram's hours for work as Main Street Manager for the month of June. Motion carried with a vote of 5-0.**

**b. Engineering Projects (Joe Sisler, Sisler-Maggard Engineering, LLC)**

**i. 2024 Water Improvement Projects**

**a. Contract 26 Mt. Washington Rd (SR 44)**

Joe Sisler, Sisler-Maggard Engineering, LLC reported on the Contract 26 Mt. Washington Rd (SR-44) project.

**b. SR 660 Pump Station**

Joe Sisler, Sisler-Maggard Engineering, LLC, gave an update on the SR 660 Pump Station.

Mr. Sisler stated that the design and application for the 660 Pump Station is in the process of being reviewed by DOW and the cost estimate does not include 2 generators.

**ii. Prioritized Projects & Funding Sources**

- a. Joe Sisler, Sisler-Maggard Engineering, LLC reported on Prioritized Projects. Upon recommendation from John Harris, CPA, the City can proceed with project #1 Mt. Washington Road (in City) and #4 Southville Pike/Buckley Rd.
- b. Joe Sisler, Sisler-Maggard Engineering, LLC suggested Project #5 S.R. 660 12” Waterline Replacement to proceed with the design and submit to DOW

**Motion was made by Commissioner Spears and seconded by Commissioner Bentley to pay invoice 24020-5 submitted by Sisler-Maggard Engineering, PLLC. in the amount of \$70,767.80. Motion carried with a vote of 5-0.**

**Motion was made by Commissioner Spears and seconded by Commissioner Bell to proceed with Project #1 Mt. Washington Road (in City) using loan money and Project #4 Southville Pike/Buckley Road Waterline Replacements using city funds. Motion carried with a vote of 5-0.**

**Motion was made by Commissioner Spears and seconded by Commissioner Hilbert to allow Sisler-Maggard Engineering, PLLC to proceed with the design of the S.R. 66 12” waterline Replacement and easements and submit to DOW. Motion carried with a vote of 5-0.**

**c. Lilly Pike Pump Station –**

Joe Sisler, Sisler-Maggard Engineering, LLC, addressed the Commission with an update on the Lilly Pike Pump Station project. Mr. Sisler stated that the Lilly Pike Pump Station is completed and operational. The general contractor has agreed to complete the list of items that need to be completed before the project can be closed.

**d. Sidewalks –**

Joe Sisler, Sisler-Maggard Engineering, LLC gave an update on the sidewalk project stating KDOT would like a different engineering company to do the final inspection. Joe Sisler stated he would be willing to waive the \$28,000 inspection fee and donate it to the City of Taylorsville if the city would be willing to ask KDOT for a waiver.

**Item #9– New Business**

**i. Police – Brian Sumner, Police Chief**

- a. Brian Sumner, Police Chief, addressed the Commission with the June report. There were 8 citations, 124 complaints, 1 school visit, 0 DUIs, 279 business checks, and 36 county runs that were mostly backups.
- b. Brian Sumner, Police Chief, recommended the Commission renew the Annual Employment Contract for Doug Des Ruisseaux.

**Motion was made by Mayor Spencer and seconded by Commissioner Hilbert to approve the renewal of the Annual Employment Contract for Officer Doug Des Ruisseaux. Motion carried with a vote of 5-**

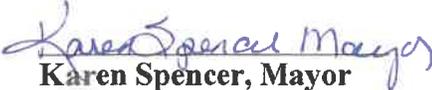
