

CITY OF TAYLORSVILLE
SPECIAL CALLED MEETING
OF THE TAYLORSVILLE CITY COMMISSION
NOVEMBER 11th, 2025 @ 5:00 P.M.

Mayor Karen Spencer called to order the special called meeting of the Taylorsville City Commission at 5:00 p.m. Mayor Spencer welcomed those in attendance followed with a prayer by Commissioner Bell. Roll call of the Commission revealed the following:

Employees present – Marcia Finley, Dave Bollinger, John Harris, Scott Williams, Stacey Crenshaw, and City Attorney, Robert Myles.

Agenda. ***Mayor Spencer made a motion to accept the agenda as presented, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.***

Reports. A) Planning & Zoning – City Clerk, Marcia Finley, informed the Commission of an opening on the Planning & Zoning Committee. Paula Wheatley has resigned from her position effective October 31, 2025. Mayor Spencer asked the Commission to be thinking of a replacement and to bring it to the next meeting.

(B) Main Street – Beverly Ingram presented her report to the Commission along with her hours. ***Mayor Spencer made a motion to approve Beverly Ingram's 80 hours of service, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.***

(C) Tourism – Katherin Scott presented 3 Resolutions to the Commission asking the city for support and not funding. After a brief discussion Mayor Spencer made a motion to accept the 3 Resolutions, 2025-08 a joint Resolution between the City of Taylorsville and Spencer County requesting funding from the Commonwealth of Kentucky for reconstruction of the Historic Felix Grundy Stidger Cabin, Resolution 2025-09 in support of the Taylorsville Main Street Organization and its efforts towards the revitalization and beautification of the historic Main Street Corridor and Resolution 2025-10 in support of the Taylorsville Main Street Organization, the Taylorsville-Spencer County Recreation, Tourist and Convention Commission in their efforts to seek funding for the creation of a local small business incentive, incubation, and growth program, seconded by Commissioner Spears with all ayes being cast. Ms. Scott also reminded everyone of a community meeting being held on Wednesday evening at 5:30 p.m. at the Public Library. (D) Police – Brian Sumner reported his department completed 2 citations, 1 DUI arrest, 6 courtesy notices, 146 complaints, 110 school visits, 1 criminal case opened, 96 special details, 4 motorists assists, 3 criminal

arrests, 4 accident investigations, 1 warrant served, 1 call response, 6 follow up investigations, 263 business checks, and 22 County complaints. Chief Sumner also informed the Commission of various items of equipment the Sheriff's Office has given to his department. Chief Sumner asked the Commission if they would be willing to donate \$2500 to the Sheriff's Office. **Mayor Spencer made a motion to donate \$2500 to the Spencer County Sheriff's Office, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** (E) Community Events – City Comptroller, John Harris informed the Commission of the budget allowed for donations for the fiscal year. Comptroller Harris said there was \$11,000 in the budget but that doesn't mean they have to spend it all. Commissioner Hilbert asked if the city donated money to Christmas on Main last year. (F) Chamber of Commerce Donation – **Mayor Spencer made a motion to donate \$3,000 to the Chamber of Commerce to help with building improvements, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** (G) Sisler & Maggard – Joe Sisler reported on Mt. Washington and Pump Station 660. Mr. Sisler said they are still waiting for the pump station to be shipped from California. Mr. Sisler asked for payment of invoices totaling \$67,437. **Mayor Spencer made a motion to pay the invoices, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** (H) Public Works – Public Works Director, Dave Bollinger reported he has one truck in the shop and when it gets fixed, he will send another truck. Both trucks are used to spread salt and plow snow. Mr. Bollinger presented the Commission with a quote from Lemna for \$39,000 to clean the tarp at the wastewater treatment plant. **Commissioner Bentley made a motion to accept the quote from Lemna for \$39,000, seconded by Commissioner Spears with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** Public Works Director, Dave Bollinger also mentioned an idea of the city operating the wastewater treatment plant owned by Spencer County for a fee. Mr. Bollinger mentioned he would attend the Public Hearing on December 2nd that the Spencer County Sanitation District is having and encouraged the Commission to go as well. Bollinger also mentioned to the Commission that cuts that were made in the road on Garrard Street were for water repairs and the street could be fixed using water money. **Mayor Spencer made a motion to repair the cuts in Garrard Street with water money, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** Bollinger then informed the Commission of an expo being held in Indianapolis, Indiana that it will have all kinds of trucks including vac trucks on site. He mentioned that sometimes you can purchase the demo for a cheaper price. At this time, Commissioner Spears said she would like for it to be stated in the minutes that on October 3, 2024 she made a motion to get bids to have the tarp cleaned and it was seconded by Commissioner Hilbert and that it was up to City Clerk, Steve Biven to follow through with it and he never did. After researching the Minutes, I found on October 8th, 2024, that Steve Biven asked the Commission to consider having the tarp cleaned professionally and to approve getting bids. Commissioner Nation asked the

Public Works Director, Harold Compton, if he knew of any companies that provide that service and Mr. Compton said he wasn't aware of any. Commissioner Spears made a motion to get bids to clean the sewer tarp and Commissioner Hilbert seconded and motion carried 5-0. (See Attached)

Interlocal Agreement with Spencer County Sanitation District. Mayor Spencer asked Bill Drury if they had notified their customers that their water would be shut off for non-payment of their sewer bills. Mr. Drury said they have already been notified. ***Mayor Spencer made a motion to accept the Interlocal Agreement allowing the City of Taylorsville to disconnect water for the non-payment of Spencer County Sanitation District's sewer bills, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0***

Invoice – Brian Shelbourne. Mr. Shelbourne has previously sent an invoice for resealing stamped concrete on Main Street and for 4 planter pots totaling \$2,415. ***Mayor Spencer made a motion to pay the invoice of \$2,415, seconded by Commissioner Spears with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0***

Cassidy Drive Easement. Public Works Director, Dave Bollinger said he has looked at the property and their garage is nowhere near the easement for the water line, and he has no issues with releasing the easement. ***Mayor Spencer made a motion to release the easement for 251 Cassidy Drive, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.***

Contract for Sanitation Services. City Clerk, Marcia Finley advised the Commission the contract for sanitation services with Rumpke expires on December 31, 2025. Clerk Finley presented a copy of the advertisement for bid that will be placed in the local newspapers for the next 2 weeks and a copy of the current contract with Rumpke.


Mold Remediation Update. City Clerk, Marcia Finley informed the Commission that the company doing the mold remediation found where the roof has been leaking. The roof repairs were not in the original contract because he was told the roof was just put on in 2023. Photos of the hole in the roof were submitted to the Commission. After a brief discussion the Commission decided to have City Attorney, Robert Myles to contact the previous company that put the new roof on and let him know they failed to replace a section of board that had a hole in it. Attorney Myles asked the City Clerk to get him a price on what the new repairs cost.

Executive Session. Mayor Spencer made a motion to go into executive session for personnel issues and possible litigation, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.



i. Utility – Harold Compton, Public Works Director

a. Harold Compton, Public Works Director, did not have a report for September in open session.

b. Sewer tarp
