SPECIAL CALLED MEETING
OF THE TAYLORSVILLE CITY COMMISSION
FEBRUARY 24th, 2026 @ 5:00 P.M.

Mayor Pro Tem, Diana Hilbert called to order the special called meeting of the Taylorsville City Commission at 5:00 p.m. Mayor Pro Tem Hilbert welcomed those in attendance followed with a prayer by Commissioner Bell. Roll call of the Commission revealed the following:

Agenda. Commissioner Hilbert made a motion to accept the agenda after adding Dave Bollinger, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 4-0.

Minutes. Commissioner Hilbert made a motion to accept February 10th and February 16th minutes as presented, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 4-0.

Dave Bollinger. Public Works Director, Dave Bollinger asked the Commission to approve a credit for a customer's water bill. Bollinger explained that the contractors replacing water lines had caused damage to the service line resulting in a leak and high water bill. Commissioner Spears stated the amount credited should be the responsibility of the contractor. The customer's normal bill runs around \$90-100, and the leak resulted in a \$400 water bill. ***Commissioner Hilbert made a motion to allow the customer to pay their normal amount and to collect the remaining from the contractor's bond, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 4-0.***

Tourism Vacancy. No Action. Tabled until next meeting.

Chamber of Commerce Shakespear on Main. Jeff Davis with the Chamber of Commerce spoke about the challenges of sponsorship the Chamber is having for Shakespear on Main.

Special Event Permit. A special event permit for Shakespear on Main has been approved through Brian Sumner, Police Chief and is now waiting for Commission approval.

Commissioner Hilbert made a motion to approve the special event permit, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 4-0.

Mold Update-Change Order. City Clerk Marcia Finley presented the Commission with a change order in the amount of \$25,596 for new cabinetry and custom-built desks. These items were not part of the original renovations as mold was found afterwards. After a brief discussion the Commission decided to have Best Option Renovations to get more bids.

Purchase Order Policy. City Attorney Robert Myles, read a municipal order to have the current purchase order policy removed and to reinstate it to the previous purchase order policy. City Comptroller John Harris says he will be speaking with Sage accounting software to see the possibilities of adding a purchase order request which is what is needed for approval before the purchase order. It was also discussed to have the Commission approve anything over \$5,000. This matter was tabled until next meeting.




