

CITY OF TAYLORSVILLE
SPECIAL CALLED MEETING
OF THE TAYLORSVILLE CITY COMMISSION
MARCH 10th, 2026 @ 5:00 P.M.

Mayor Karen Spencer called to order the special called meeting of the Taylorsville City Commission at 5:00 p.m. Mayor Spencer welcomed those in attendance followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Police Chief, Brian Sumner and a prayer by Commissioner Bell. Roll call of the Commission revealed the following:

Agenda. Mayor Spencer made a motion to accept the agenda as presented, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.

Reports. A. Tourism – Terry Cooper spoke for Tourism and reminded everyone of the Fourth of July festivities coming up. Ms. Cooper said they are using grant money for the event. Tourism is also seeking donations from the City of Taylorsville. Mayor Spencer said the Commission would need to get with the City Comptroller to see how much money is left in the budget for donations. B. Main Street – Beverly Ingram gave her monthly report and invoice. ***Mayor Spencer made a motion to accept Ms. Ingram’s invoice, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.*** C. Sisler Maggard – Joe and Kevin Sisler reported the 660 Kings Church Rd. project is waiting for the gas company to locate lines, the Wastewater Force Main from Pin Oak to WWTP project is 60% complete, the Existing S.R. 660 Pump Station should have previously had a by-pass around it and needs to be bid out, the Mt. Washington Rd. S.R. 44 Waterline Replacement is 75% complete and the Southville Pike Buckley Rd. Waterline is 15% complete. Kevin Sisler asked for approval of invoices for those projects totaling in the amount of \$40,279.67. ***Commissioner Bell made a motion to approve the invoices in the amount of \$40,279.67, seconded by Mayor Spencer with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.*** D. Public Works – Dave Bollinger says he would like to advertise for 2 positions of Water Distribution Operator. Bollinger asked for Commission approval for a disconnect at Lilly Pike in the amount of \$6,820.54. Mr. Bollinger presented 2 quotes, one from Flynn Brothers for black-topping Settlers Blvd at a price of \$42,458.60 and the second quote was from Digital Efx Wraps for 12 sets of door

decals for the public works trucks in the amount of \$685.00. **Mayor Spencer made a motion to advertise for the 2 job positions of Water Distribution Operators, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0. Mayor Spencer made a motion to approve \$6,820.54 for the Lilly Pike disconnect, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0. Commissioner Spears made a motion to accept the quote in the amount of \$685.00 for the door decals, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** No action was taken on blacktopping Settlers Blvd. E. Police – Police Chief, Brian Sumner introduced Rob Renner with the Spencer County Public Safety Foundation. Mr. Renner said he is looking for donations in the amount of \$6,000 for the non-profit organization, and said he isn't looking for anything until next fiscal year. Chief Sumner then reported his department completed 16 citations, 1 DUI arrest, 9 speeding citations, 21 courtesy notices, 177 complaints, 145 school visits, 1 criminal case opened, 121 special details, 4 motorists assist, 2 criminal arrests, 6 accident investigations, 22 investigation follow ups, 350 business checks, and 29 County complaints. Chief Sumner also informed the Commission he has approved 2 Special Events Permits for the Tourism Board. One is for the Fourth of July and the other is for Real Country. Chief Sumner also informed the Commission he has made some changes to the permit, including highlighting the barricade fee. Chief Sumner also reported he is looking at body cams for the department. The cameras are the same as the Sheriff's Office is using. **Mayor Spencer made a motion to accept the 2 Special Events Permits, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** No action was taken on the body cams. Tabled until next meeting. F. Financial – None. G. City Clerk – Marcia Finley reported the fire alarm system at the Annex building has not been working for some time. Clerk Finley said she called Interstate Alarm Systems, and they came out and looked at it. Interstate said it needed a whole new panel and the quote they sent is for \$8,820.00. **Mayor Spencer made a motion to accept the quote from Interstate for \$8,820.00, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** H. Front Office – Stacey Crenshaw asked the Commission if she could set up billing accounts for hydrant meters rather than sending a paper invoice. Commissioner Bell said he wants to see the financials at the next meeting. **Mayor Spencer made a motion to set up billing for hydrant meters, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.**

Legal. *Municipal Order 2026-003 Restricted Public Access* – City Attorney Robert Myles, read the Municipal Order restricting public access to certain areas of city owned property. **Commissioner Hilbert made a motion to approve the Municipal Order 2026-003, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all eyes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** *Purchase Order Policy* – This was tabled until next meeting to allow Comptroller, John Harris time to talk to Oasis about adding a purchase request to the software. *Streets/Potholes* –


City Attorney Robert Myles spoke about Walter Hahn Street that was previously adopted by the City after 5 years of unrestricted use. Attorney Myles said there is additional paperwork that needs to be completed to make it official. After a brief discussion the Commission decided to send letters to the property owners who currently have potholes in need of fixing and to invite them to the next City Commission meeting. **Mayor Spencer made a motion to let the Attorney proceed with paperwork to finalize the adoption of Walter Hahn and to have City Clerk Marcia Finley mail out letters to property owners for potholes, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.** Attorney Myles also informed the Commission That Attorney Donald Wakefield will be handling the Federal lawsuit filed by Mike Easter.


Executive Session. Mayor Spencer made a motion to go into executive session, seconded by Commissioner Hilbert with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.

Open Session. Mayor Spencer made a motion to come back to open session, seconded by Commissioner Bentley with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.

Action Taken. Commissioner Bell made a motion to send a verbal warning from the Commission to Scott Williams requiring him to wear his eyeglasses the whole day when he is at work and to only allow a take home vehicle when someone is on call, seconded by Mayor Spencer with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.

Adjournment. This concluding the business of the meeting, Mayor Spencer made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Bell with all ayes being cast. Motion carried 5-0.
